



A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

"I'm not trying to stump anybody...it's the beauty of the language that I'm interested in..."

- Buddy Holly



Charles Hardin Holley, known as Buddy Holly, was born in Lubbock, Texas in 1936. At a young age he quickly became a staple of 50's Rock n' Roll, influencing the likes of The Beatles, Bob Dylan, the Rolling Stones, Eric Clapton, Elvis Costello, Elton John, and many more. He was a pioneer for the two guitars, bass, and drums combo; and his music, along with 50's Rock in general, brought people together in ways that other things should have, but didn't. Buddy was clear in his intentions and open with his opinions, all while being as polite as can

be; he wore his emotions on his sleeve but rarely lost his cool; and his passion for success and perfection both drove him and hindered him throughout his short, but infamous, life. I owe my career, and the shaping of my life, to this man, and I thank him and everyone else who has made my journey with this show possible.

A decade ago, I was sitting in my college dorm room, scrolling through the internet looking for roles I might be able to play one day, and I happened upon Buddy Holly. I thought, "That'd be cool at some point..." not knowing that just a year later I'd be fortunate enough to attempt my first "Buddy." Come to find out, I'm also "tall, skinny, and somewhat play guitar" (thanks Allan), and after a ton of practice (still practicing...) and my first production, it quickly became my new lifestyle as I started traveling the country working on productions of *Buddy*, both on and off the stage. His story and music has allowed me to meet so many amazing people who knew or met him, as well as so many incredible humans who I've been fortunate enough to share the stage and play music with over these past nine years. My life would be so incredibly different if it wasn't for this show and my theatre/actor-musician family, and I'm forever grateful to The Wick Theatre for allowing me to lead this production and don the horn-rimmed glasses one more time.

To Natalie, Sarah, Brandon, James and "Buddy's" past, and to my cast, crew and production team here, I'm forever indebted to you for helping me tell this story. It's truly been an honor. This one's for you.



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


