



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

A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR



Welcome to the Wick Theater and its longawaited production of "Fiddler on the Roof", one of the most successful and long running Broadway musicals of all time. Fiddler's original Broadway production in 1964 was nominated for 10 Tony awards, winning 9, including best musical, score and book, best direction and choreography, best featured actress, and best lead actor, Zero Mostel. This heartwarming story of the dairyman Tevye, his family, and the

village of Anatevka under czarist Russian rule, has entertained and inspired generations.

My first exposure to this wonderful musical was as a twenty year old dancer in a production at the St. Louis "Muny Opera", a huge outdoor summer theater. As usual, we had one week of rehearsal with dancers in one studio, singers in another, and principal actors joining us on the

final day of rehearsal - where all the different elements of the production were combined. Having been raised in a good catholic household, I had very little insight into what "Fiddler" was all about. Not until the final bows on opening night, when I saw an audience of twelve thousand people stand, cheer, and applaud, did I realize that this show was something very, very special!

As my theatrical career progressed, I went from dancer to choreographer to director in many more productions of "Fiddler". Working with various wonderful "Tevye's", such as Robert Merrill, Herschel Bernardi, and Theodore Bikel, I learned to love this incredible musical. If I had to retire, after forty years in theater, I hope "Fiddler" would be my final production.
